

***About the organization of remote studies and the use of protective face masks at the Transport and Telecommunication Institute (TSI)***

1. Because of the spread of coronavirus infection COVID-19 and in accordance with the recommendations of the Cabinet of Ministers, starting from October 16, 2020 until November 15, 2020, lectures for 3, 4, and 5 courses students of full-time and part-time studies (bachelors and professional bachelors) will be organized mostly remotely.
2. The Study department, in agreement with the deans of the faculties, determines the list of specific study groups who shall study remotely, and inform the students of the corresponding group and lecturers, and enter this information into the class schedule.
3. Any other events in the premises of TSI can be organized by coordinating their conduct with the management of the Institute, and observing the restrictions established by the current regulations of the Cabinet of Ministers.
4. To decide that for the period from October 16, 2020 to November 15, 2020, students, lecturers and employees:
  - 4.1. It is necessary to use protective face masks when visiting the library
  - 4.2. while in the TSI premises (especially during classes), if the distance between students and lecturers or between students is less than 2 meters, it is necessary to use protective masks or face shields
  - 4.3. the head of the relevant department determines the need of the using protective masks or shields in the premises of the department, taking into attention the specific of work;
5. The Study department shall ensure control over the execution of clause 4.2. of this order in relation to attending classes.
6. The Study department shall translate the order into English and Russian and submit the translated text of the order to the Marketing and Communications Department for publication on the TSI homepage
